Dear Friends,

When I tell people where I work, many relate a story about a relative or a friend who has been a victim of power-based violence. The more I talk to others about intimate partner violence, sexual assault, or child abuse, the more apparent it becomes that these crimes affect virtually everybody.

COVID-19 has had a significant impact on all layers and sectors of our society, but families have suffered the brunt of this collective trauma. Since the beginning of the pandemic, the number of individuals we serve has risen by 40%. Not only that, but the severity of violence our clients are experiencing is like nothing we have seen in our history.

Facing the continuing increase in need in Frederick County, we spent much of 2022 expanding the breadth and depth of our services. We now have three satellite offices in the community and are soon to begin a Spanish language abuse intervention group. We have shored up both our programmatic and administrative infrastructure and are looking forward to having one full-time and one part-time paid staff supporting our IT infrastructure in fiscal year 2023.

We recognize that the effects of COVID-19 will be with us for years to come. Fortunately, with the community's support, we have grown to meet many of the increasing needs. We hope you will remain a supporter or maybe even enhance your contributions to Heartly House, so together, we can continue to grow and save lives.

Blaine Hoffmann

Our community lost a great attorney, colleague, and friend on August 19, 2022.

Blaine Hoffmann began his work as Legal Director with Heartly House in April of 2007.

A tireless advocate for survivors and their families, Blaine's work went well beyond protective orders and custody hearings—he took a holistic approach in assisting our clients, making sure they had what they needed to be safe and thriving even after their work with Heartly House was concluded.

Blaine brought compassion and kindness to the courthouse and to other spaces where he ventured. He had the kind of presence that has left a noticeable absence, and the kind of life that left an indelible mark on our community.

For many in our community, the past year signified a return to some semblance of normalcy following interruptions to employment, education, and our personal lives as a result of COVID-19. For families living in violent homes however, normalcy just means more of the same.

How We Helped

Community-Based Services

3 new satellite locations opened to serve a wider geographic area in Frederick County.

1 satellite location became fully operational in March 2022.

2 additional satellite locations pending launch in FY23 have been fully funded in large part by a five-year Partnership Grant with the Ausherman Family Foundation as well as Frederick County ARPA Funding.

17 clients served.

97 information and referral contacts.

35 contacts regarding safety planning.

Counseling

1,975 total individual counseling sessions.

142 adults participated in individual counseling.

26 children/teens received individual counseling.

200 group counseling sessions.

102 adults participated in group counseling.

CLINICAL OUTCOMES

Of **39** client survey respondents who had experienced intimate partner violence,

95% felt more knowledgeable about how to plan for their own safety.

89% felt safer after counseling with the Heartly House team.

100% understood that they are not responsible for the abuse they experienced.

89% had a better understanding of power and control in intimate partner violence.

Of the **19** client survey respondents who had experienced sexual assault,

89% had a better understanding of the symptoms related to trauma.

95% believed that counseling helped to improve their situation.

Human Trafficking

37 victims of human trafficking were supported.

↑ 35% increase over prior year.

59% of all primary victims are children.

FY 22 LETHALITY SCREENING

The Lethality Assessment Program—Maryland Model (LAP) is an evidence-based assessment tool utilized by law enforcement officers and community professionals to identify victims at the highest risk of being killed or seriously harmed by their partners. We continue to monitor and evolve our services to meet the multi-year increase in screenings found to be “high risk.”

In FY22, 78% of 996 lethality screens identified the victim at high risk of homicide or severe physical injury.

91% reported feeling safer as a result of the legal services representation received for protective order hearings and granting of the court order.

Engagement & Prevention

“Excuse me, is this your pen?”

This year, the Community Engagement & Prevention Department began a new program aimed at promoting bystander intervention strategies. The “Excuse Me” campaign is intended to be an interactive project that will allow people to think through how they might intervene in a situation that could potentially lead to violence. Many times, people feel like they are not equipped to step in and say something, even when they feel they should. The bystander intervention model teaches people practical methods they can use to first assess for safety of self and others, and then how to ask questions or get help in situations. By providing potential bystanders with two simple words, “Excuse me...,” we are showing that anyone can ask a question to neutralize or distract and feel empowered to stand up and step in.

As the world began opening back up, our Community Engagement & Prevention team started getting back out into the community. We offered 40 programs in person and online and were able to speak to over 600 people on topics such as:

- Bystander Intervention
- Understanding Intimate Partner Violence
- Understanding Sexual Violence
- Understanding Human Trafficking
- Supporting Survivors Through the Holidays
- Stalking
- Understanding Financial Abuse
- Teen Dating Violence & Healthy Relationships

Additionally, the team began looking at ways to expand Heartly House’s social media presence and added a TikTok channel to our lineup. With the addition of this platform, along with Instagram Reels, our reach has dramatically expanded.

Community Engagement & Prevention staff added a new annual event to the lineup this year with Take Back the Night, which will join Walk a Mile in Their Shoes as an anchor event for Heartly House. They also collaborated with Hood College to host a Walk a Mile event on campus. Additionally, the team has been active on campus at Mount St. Mary’s University and Frederick Community College, providing training to students and staff. 
