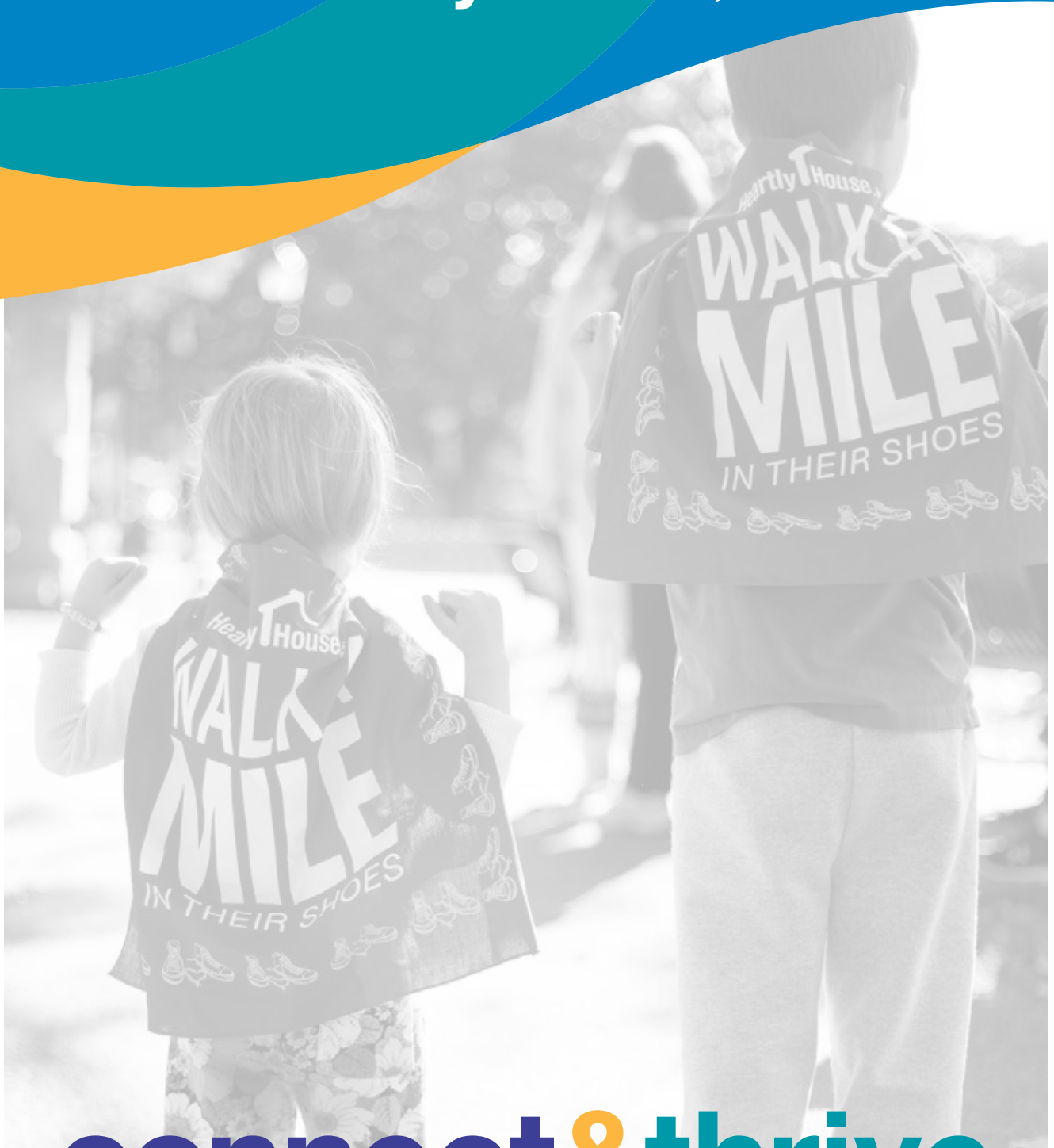

CRISIS SERVICES

Crisis Services is often a survivor’s first step in their journey toward safety and healing.

In 2025 alone, we responded to thousands of calls, ranging from life-threatening emergencies to requests for resources and guidance. Every hour of every day, our trained advocates are here so no one has to face fear or danger alone.

Our team conducts Lethality Assessment Program (LAP) screenings to assess IPV homicide risk and connect clients with a network of care: emergency shelter, legal advocacy, medical accompaniment, and more. Our team also assists with applications to the Maryland Address Confidentiality Program and the Maryland Victims Compensation Program, and coordinates Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) services in partnership with the Frederick County Adult Detention Center.

HEARTLY HOUSE’S EMERGENCY SHELTER

Our shelter provides a safe, confidential refuge for survivors of intimate partner violence, sexual assault, or human trafficking who are in imminent danger of severe injury or death.

While in shelter, clients are not only in a safe place, but they are also offered critical support services such as counseling, case management, and access to basic needs in order to provide stability and safety during crisis.

This outreach-centered approach ensures that critical services, like case management, safety planning, housing and healthcare navigation, and emotional support, are readily accessible and provided by our steady, supportive team.

SERVICES FOR HUMAN TRAFFICKING SURVIVORS

This team provides wraparound care to survivors up to age 24. From food and housing to counseling and long-term emotional support, we help clients move from crisis to stability. We also provide counseling and support to secondary survivors, who are those impacted by the trauma experienced by someone they care about.

The Regional Navigator program provides personalized guidance and service coordination through screening, advocacy, and case management. Heartly House is proud to be Co-Chair of the Frederick County Human Trafficking Response Team (HTRT), working collaboratively to identify survivors, connect them to services, and raise awareness throughout our community.

COUNSELING SERVICES

Heartly House offers free, confidential, trauma-informed counseling to child, adult, and secondary survivors, ensuring every voice is heard and every story honored.

Our licensed clinicians understand that trauma can affect every part of a person’s life; emotionally, physically, and relationally. Each session is part of a broader whole.

Through both individual and group sessions, we help survivors begin the process of rebuilding. We don’t just help survivors cope; we help them reclaim their voice, rebuild trust, and step into a future that feels possible.

LEGAL SERVICES

Legal services are an essential part of the comprehensive support we provide to survivors.

Interwoven with our crisis response, counseling, case management and advocacy efforts, our legal team helps clients navigate life, ensuring they are not alone in seeking safety and justice.

Through Advocate accompaniment or attorney representation, protective orders, family law matters, and criminal court proceedings, legal advocacy strengthens every step of a survivor’s journey, reinforcing their path toward stability and healing.

Clients who come to us for legal help are embraced by a network of support that strengthens every aspect of their recovery. These threads come together to form a stronger, more resilient path forward; where justice is pursued not in isolation, but as part of holistic healing.

Our educators help students explore healthy relationships, boundaries, and self-advocacy. When needed, we connect students to case management, counseling, and crisis services—meeting them where they are: in schools.

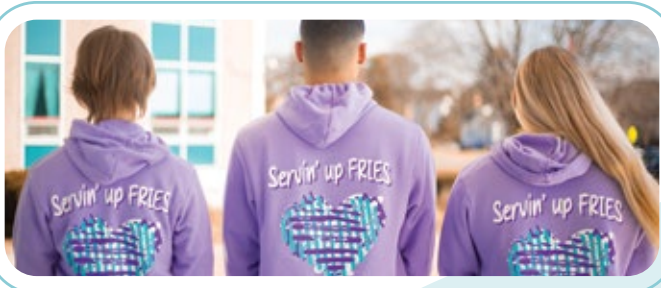
PROJECT H.E.A.R.T.S.

Project H.E.A.R.T.S. (Healing, Empowerment, Allies, Resilience, Trust & Safety) is a youth-focused initiative that promotes emotional well-being and relationship skills for middle and high school students in Frederick County. The program delivers trauma-informed, age-appropriate education that encourages students to build trust, set boundaries, express themselves, and form respectful connections in partnership with Frederick County Public Schools. Through school workshops, after-school clubs, and immersive summer programs, Project H.E.A.R.T.S. meets youth where they are and gives them tools to navigate relationships in stronger, healthier ways.

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SURVIVOR SPEAKERS BUREAU

Our Survivor Speakers Bureau allows survivors to share their stories and engage with audiences, because the first step to understanding power-based violence is to listen. Now in its third year, the Bureau has trained 24 speakers who have shared their stories at local and national events, panels, podcasts, and in classrooms alongside our Project H.E.A.R.T.S. team.



EDUCATIONAL TRAININGS & OUTREACH

Heartly House provides training for businesses, schools, agencies, faith groups, and community organizations across Frederick County that equip participants to recognize abuse, support survivors, and foster a culture of safety. Last year, we expanded youth outreach in partnership with Frederick Community College, Hood College, and Mount St. Mary’s University to lay a foundation for prevention and awareness across campuses.

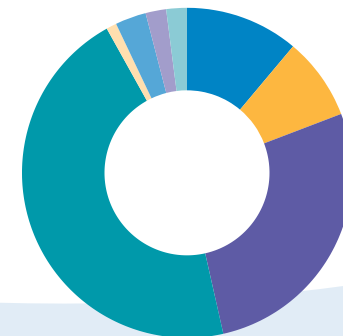
COCKTAILS & CARBS
